Types of Sessions/Presentations:

- **Paper Presentations** - Single paper presentations provide an opportunity for individuals to share their work and might include a summary of research conducted. Typically, presentations last 30-35 minutes with 5-10 minutes for discussion (40 min.).
- **Roundtable Discussions** - Multiple presenters provide a variety of perspectives on an issue related to the conference. Typically, each individual presentation lasts 10 minutes with 5-10 minutes for discussion (40 min.).
- **Poster Presentations** - Poster sessions combine the graphic display of materials with the opportunity for individualized, informal discussion of topics. This is a wonderful way for preservice teachers (undergraduate & graduate), faculty members, and others to informally share their work.
